Meet Charlie Prucha, SFWD Superintendent

Charlie Prucha is very clear about his approach to both his professional and personal lives: "I like things simple and direct, and I like to take care of things as they come up."

This summer Charlie was awarded the position of Superintendent at South Farmingdale Water District based on his work ethic and experience with the District, where he has amassed comprehensive knowledge of its operations, plans and personnel during the past 30 years.

Charlie points out that most issues can be, and are, resolved quickly. "The beauty of local water supply control is that we can address any customer issue immediately, with minimal bureaucratic red tape," he says.

He began his career in 1978 as a Water Plant Operator Trainee, learning operational fundamentals by performing routine maintenance duties. In 1983, he earned his New York State 2A Pump Operators License, which paved the way for his promotion to Water Plant Servicer

and in 1991, to Water Plant Operator.

Charlie has also attained New York State's highest operator's license, a 1A-SW/GUI Water Systems Operators License.

In 2003, he was named General Foreman with the duty of overseeing all pump operations, meter readings, repairs, water sampling, restoration and general maintenance.

On a personal note, Charlie is a self-admitted home body. His favorite hobbies are not golfing, fishing or tennis, but redecorating, redesigning and remodeling his Lindenhurst home. He is very "hands on" at home as well as at the SFWD, and is truly a "man about the house."



Winterizing Solutions at Home

- Disconnect all outdoor hoses. Drain and store them in a garage, shed or basement.
- Turn off the water leading to the outside of your house.
- Leave outside water faucets open.
 This allows any trapped water to expand during a freeze and prevents broken pipes.
- Be sure to stop all drafts in your basement so pipes won't freeze.
- Cover your outdoor pool or hot tub to reduce wasteful evaporation.

FYI: Do You Know You Are Drinking Gourmet Water?

We know our water is among the best, but recent news confirms it.

A recent editorial published by *The New York Times*, "In Praise of Tap Water," carried the themes of the AWWA's *Only Tap Water Delivers* campaign. It explained that the United States "has some of the best public water supplies in the world...almost all municipal water in America is so good that nobody needs to import a single bottle. Meanwhile, if you choose to get your recommended eight glasses a day from bottled water, you could spend up to \$1,400 annually. The same amount of tap water would cost about 49 cents."

The editorial went on to state that "the more the wealthy opt out of drinking tap water, the less political support there will be for investing in maintaining America's public water supply. That would be a serious loss. Access to cheap, clean water is basic to the nation's health."

The Today Show also held a tap water taste test, noting the environmental impact of bottled water and the solid waste problem generated by the used bottles.


Come Out and Vote
